It provides an overview of performance across educational institutions, highlighting improvements and areas of decline in judgements for the period under review.

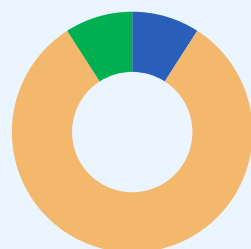
The statistical report is intended to support transparency, inform system-level understanding and contribute to ongoing improvement in educational quality and outcomes.



SCHOOL INSPECTION FINDINGS: COMPULSORY (45% Government schools & 55% Private schools)

18% of schools met expected standards of 'Good' or better

Schools judged as 'Good' perform at the expected level of quality



Compulsory School Inspection judgements (n=11)

- Good (1)
- Satisfactory (9)
- Excellent (1)

36% of schools inspected showed improvement

One school improved from 'Good' to 'Excellent'. One Government school improved to 'Good'.

Enrolment in high performing schools

Of the 2,668 students enrolled in schools inspected, 827 students attend schools judged as 'Good' or better, of which 617 (23%) were Caymanian

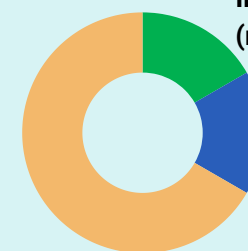

EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTRES

34% of centres achieved the 'Good' or better standard

Early Childhood Setting Inspection Judgements (n=6)

33% of centres improved their performance

One centre moved from 'Satisfactory' to 'Good' and one moved from 'Good' to 'Excellent'.

37% of children attend high-performing centres

Of the 531 children enrolled: 199 attended centres judged 'Good' or 'Excellent' and 332 attended centres judged 'Satisfactory'.

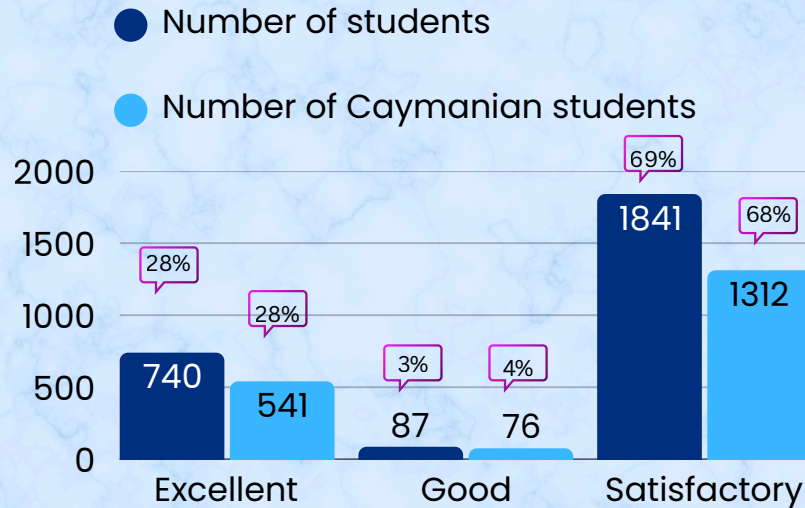

2024 FULL INSPECTION DISTRIBUTION OF JUDGEMENTS

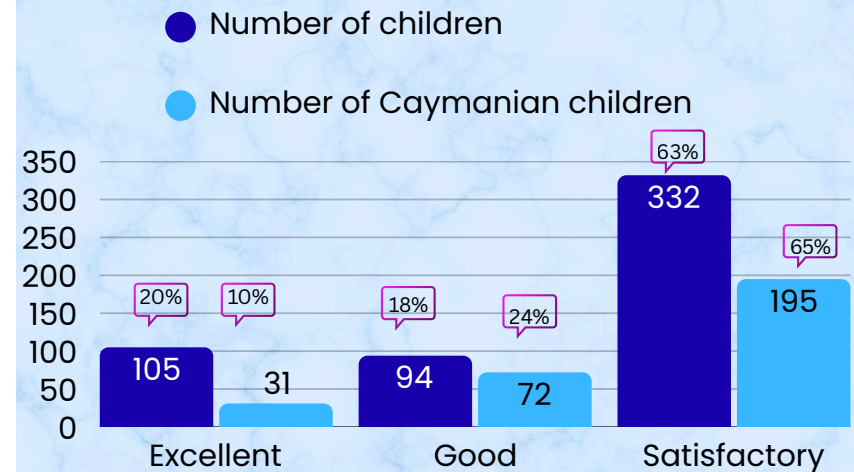


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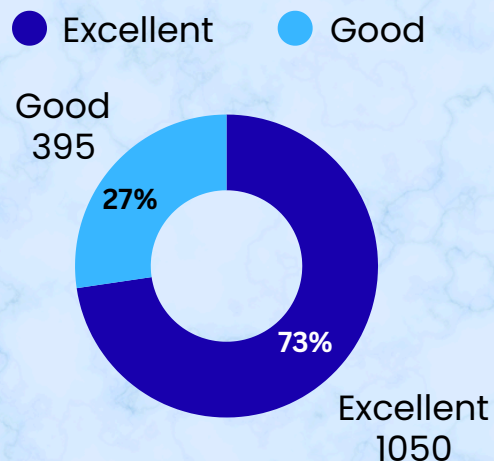
Distribution of students enrolled in schools that received full inspections in 2024

KEY FINDINGS



11 schools received Full Inspections in 2024.

One government school was judged as 'Good', improving their level of quality from previous inspections.

One private school improved its judgement from 'Good', to 'Excellent'. 36% of the schools inspected improved their judgements by one level.

Only **18%** of schools inspected in 2024 were performing at the expected level of 'Good' or better.

32% of Caymanian students enrolled at schools inspected in 2024 attend schools that were judged to be 'Good' or better.

69% of the total students enrolled, including 1,312 Caymanian students, attended schools that were judged to be not yet meeting the expected level of 'Good' performance according to the OES Successful Schools and Achieving Students 2 criteria.

6 early childhood centres received Full Inspections in 2025.

Two early childhood centres improved their judgements with one improving from 'Satisfactory' to 'Good' and the other from 'Good' to 'Excellent'.

63% of the total number of children enrolled, including 195 Caymanian children, attended early childhood centres that were judged to be not yet meeting the expected level of 'Good' performance according to the OES standards.

37% of the total children enrolled attended centres judged as 'Good' or Excellent', with 34% of them being Caymanian.

Key Findings

- One school and one early childhood centre underwent Follow-Through Inspections in 2024. The early childhood centre was judged to be making satisfactory progress towards addressing the recommendations from its previous inspection, while the school was judged to be making weak progress. The school's performance has remained weak across consecutive inspection cycles.
- A total of 140 students/children were enrolled in the school and the early childhood centre which received Follow-Through Inspections. Of these, 74% of which 33% are Caymanian were enrolled in the school found to be making weak progress.

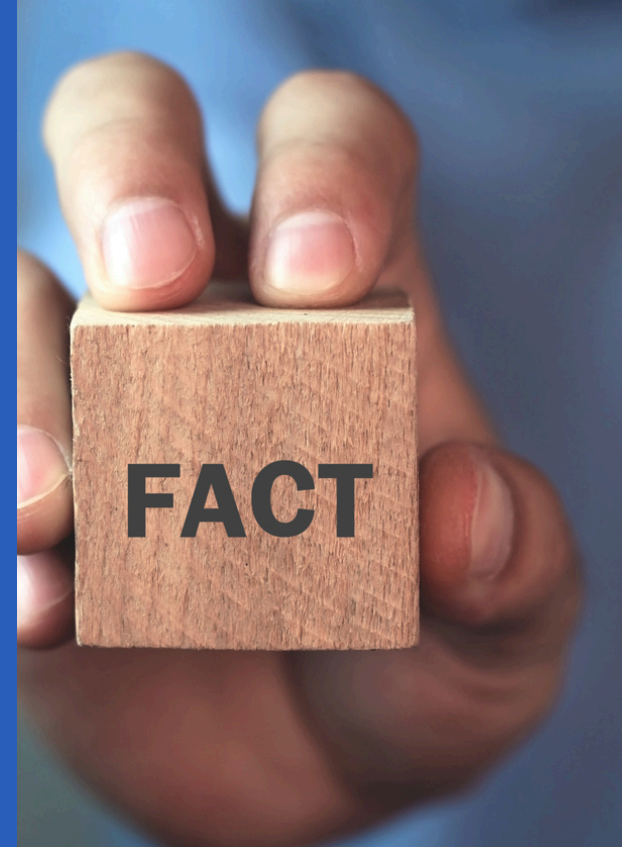
Key Findings

Five schools were evaluated as part of the Interim School Audit Inspections (Risk-Based) for 2024. Four schools had pilot interim audits in May 2024 and one school had an interim audit in October 2024. All schools maintained their judgements from the last two previous inspections..

KEY FINDINGS— INTERIM SCHOOL AUDIT INSPECTIONS

Five educational institutions, comprising four schools and one early childhood centre, received Interim School Audits in 2024 following 'Good' or better judgements in their two preceding full inspections.

73% of students were enrolled in schools that maintained an 'Excellent' judgement in their Interim School Audit. These schools comprised one private compulsory school and one private early childhood centre.



The four private schools and one government school that received an Interim School Audit had a combined enrolment of 1,445 students.
